U. S. Planes Pound Tou Morong, Seized by Communists Saturday

SAIGON, Viet Nam (Monday) (AP) — South Vietnamese troops killed seven Viet Cong provincial and local officials Sunday in a lightning raid on a Mekong Delta village 35 miles south of Saigon, U.S. military informants reported. They called it the biggest single bag of Viet Cong officials in the war.
