

John W. Haigis Jr., broadcast executive

GREENFIELD — John W. Haigis Jr., 71, president of Haigis Broadcasting Inc. and Greenfield radio stations WHAI AM and FM, died Thursday in Franklin Medical Center.

Haigis was instrumental in the founding of the Big Brother/Big Sisters of Franklin County and for many years worked with the "Keep Christ in Christmas" Committee that was responsible for the town's Christmas creche.

He served as a trustee of the University of Massachusetts from 1956 to 1975. From 1963 to 1972, he served as chairman of the UMass committee on buildings and grounds. During this period, there were many expansions at the university as well as the planning and capital outlay for the UMass Medical Center in Worcester.

The relocation of the UMass farm buildings from Amherst to South Deerfield also took place under his chairmanship.

Haigis Mall, an area in front of the Whitmore Administration Building at UMass, is named in his honor.

In 1976, he received an honorary doctor of law degree from the university.

In 1964, Haigis chaired a fund drive to expand the Franklin County Public Hospital, now the Franklin Medical Center.

Born in the Turners Falls section of Montague, he attended schools in Greenfield and Turners Falls and graduated from Deerfield Academy in 1935. He also graduated in 1939 from Amherst College and taught English and swimming at Deerfield Academy.
