HOLLYWOOD — Satellite TV should, judging from all reports, be in our midst within the next 10 years. It is going to be a rather expensive proposition, and part of the expense is going to have to be paid by us, the set owners.

Theoretically, satellite TV is quite simple. We simply toss some 30 communications satellites in the combination of the satellites. some 30 communications satel-lites into orbit at carefully worked out intervals. TV sig-nals are then bounced from satellite to satellite, as they pass over the Atlantic Ocean when beamed, say, from the U. S. to Great Britain; and British viewers, Heaven help them, will be able to see instantaneously whatever it is we choose to send them—like "Hawaiian Eye," for instance. (And they said we'd never go to war with England.)

Europe already has a 17-nation alliance which permits programs to go from nation to nation via a series of microwave relays. Such relays, unfortunately (or perhaps fortunately), can not span the ocean. Hence the satellites.

During the summer of 1960 Britain's BBC scheduled some 70 hours live TV of the Rome Olympics over a two-weck period. They had expected little or no reaction.
