

Second Thoughts On Music Concert Season to Resume Locally After the Holidays

Boston Pops Orchestra at U. of M. Jan. 3, Symphony to Play On 22d, Duo-Pianists at Holyoke On 23d; More New Recordings Heard

By WILLARD M. CLARK With the holiday season nearing its end, we can look forward to concerts again, even though this is being a comparatively dull season. The University of Massachusetts starts things going on Jan. 3 when the Boston Pops Orchestra, conducted by Arthur Fiedler, will play there. Fiedler and his men will be sure of an enthusiastic welcome from the 3000 to 4000 young people who attend these concerts sponsored by the university.

French cellist Pierre Fournier, with Malcolm Sargent conducting the Philharmonia orchestra. Even with the exciting performance Mr. Fournier gives, we find this concerto on the dull side. On the reverse side of this disk he gives a brilliant and imaginative performance of Tchaikovsky's "Variations on a Rocco Theme." Fournier is both the virtuoso and the poet.

Recent Recordings The final recordings made for the Mozart anniversary are wringing in. What a deluge it has been, yet the general caliber was pretty good. Columbia introduces the admirable French pianist Robert Casadesu in three Mozart sonatas, and on another recording, he plays, with wife Gaby Casadesu, the Mozart Concerto in E flat for two pianos and orchestra, a very well played piece. The same record also carries Mr. Casadesu as soloist in the Mozart Concerto No. 12 for piano and orchestra. George Szell conducts the Columbia Symphony orchestra with knowing style.

The husband and wife team will portray exactly what they are—two motion picture stars—in the series written by Sol Saks. As Eve Drake and Howard Duff, Miss Lupino and Duff will take viewers into the home, the studio and into virtually every corner of the private and public lives of two film stars.

Chairman of the "Years of Crisis: 1956" broadcast will be Ed Murrow, reporter and news analyst heard nightly on CBS Radio's "Edward R. Murrow with the News," host of CBS Television's "Person to Person," and reporter and coproducer of "See It Now."

Richard C. Hottel, CBS News correspondent stationed in Vienna, has covered assignments ranging from the state-side campaign and elections to the wave of anti-Communist uprisings in Germany and Poland.

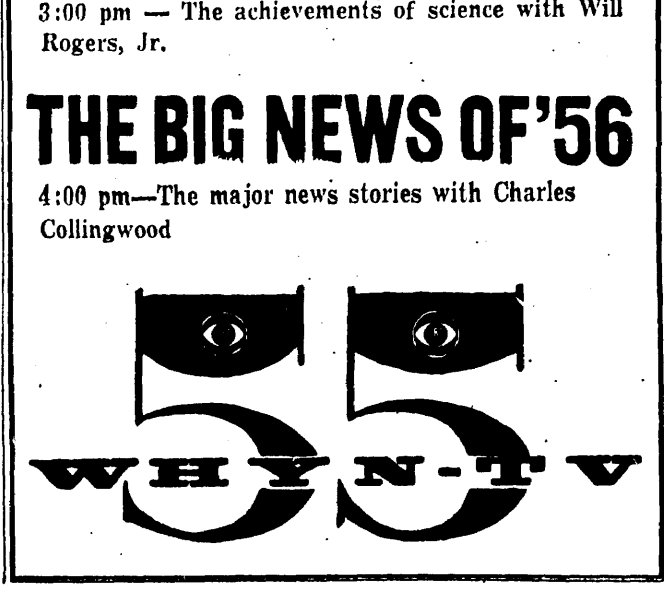
