ACTUAL COURT DECISION
YES. "This is not a suit for divorce or separation, but a law suit on a contract," the Judge held. "The separation agreement did not contain a provision requiring Gloria to remain chaste. Calvin is liable since Gloria did not in fact breach the contract."
